

Annual Genealogy Workshop Friday, March 31st & Saturday, April 1st

Register today for the Annual Genealogy Workshop with keynote presenter, Deborah A. Abbott P.H.D. Deborah is a genealogist who specializes in African American research, genealogy methodology and manuscript collections. She is an instructor at the Institute of Genealogy & Historical Research, Salt Lake Institute of Genealogy, the Genealogy Colloquium at Alabama State University and co-coordinated "Researching African American Families" at the Genealogical Research Institute of Pittsburgh. Featured Classes:

Breaking the Brick Wall: Researching in Black and White

This lecture will reconstruct an African American family from slavery to freedom. Using a case study, you will learn basic tools for family history research, analyzing the information that you find and how research will point you toward success.

Cluster Genealogy: Finding Your Lost Ancestor

This session will introduce the importance of researching ancestors by researching extended family members, friends and community. Learn to develop techniques and strategies that will help increase the chances of locating that long lost ancestor.

Researching Female Ancestors

Finding female ancestors can be challenging. Female identities prior to the twentieth century are often tangled in the records of male family members both by custom and by law. In many places, women were not allowed to own real estate in their own name, to sign legal documents, or to participate in government. This session with teach you techniques to overcome these barriers.

Vital Records: The Cornerstone of Genealogical Research

Birth, marriage, divorce, and deaths are anchors in the lives of our ancestors. Ancestral family are connected to specific times and places which may help to identify familial relationships. Learn how to find these records, the valuable information they contain, as well as identifying substitutes when these records are inaccessible or nonexistent.
