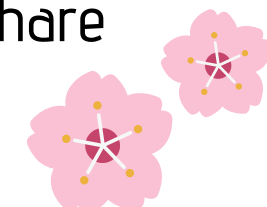
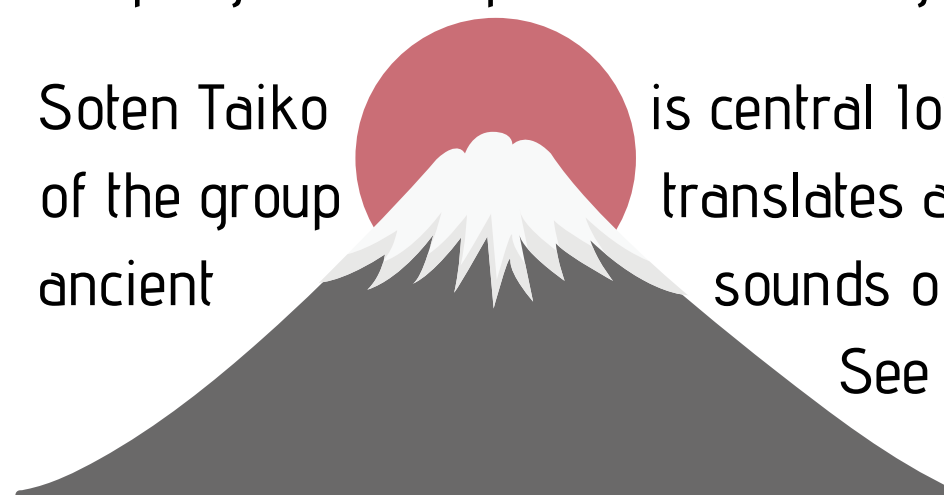


First Friday: JAPANESE CULTURE

What Is FOOTNOTES?

What is FOOTNOTES? Is it that annoying line at the bottom of the page of a book with additional information? Yes, but that's not what I am talking about this time.

FOOTNOTES is the used bookstore that is in the lobby of the Burlington Public Library. Maybe you are a regular shopper there, or maybe you have never noticed it. If the first one, THANK YOU! If the second one, you are missing out (in my opinion)!

FOOTNOTES sells adult and children books, as well as vintage and collectible books. We also sell magazines, DVDs, VHS, cassette tapes, book bags, calendars, greeting cards, and other merchandise. What kinds of books do we sell? Mystery, fiction, romance, non-fiction, sci-fi, biography, children and teens, military, and more are on our shelves. The selection is constantly changing, based on what is donated.

The best part ... hardback books are \$3, large soft cover books are \$2, and paperbacks are \$1. Children's books are all individually priced. Special books may be priced higher than \$3. Book bags are \$4. Magazines are 20 cents. Calendars are 25¢, and greeting cards are 10¢. DVDS are \$2, VHS 25¢, and cassettes \$1. The blue carts in the lobby of the Library are sale books priced at \$1 no matter the format. Have I interested you yet?

FOOTNOTES is staffed entirely by volunteers and sells donated items (except the book bags), and all proceeds go to the Library to help with non-budgeted expenditures. Last year, Friends donated nearly \$40,000 to the Library!

That money comes from FOOTNOTES, book sales, memberships, activities, and donations. Why not come in and see for yourself what great deals are to be had?

FOOTNOTES is open 10-7 Monday through Thursday, and 10-4 Friday and Saturday.

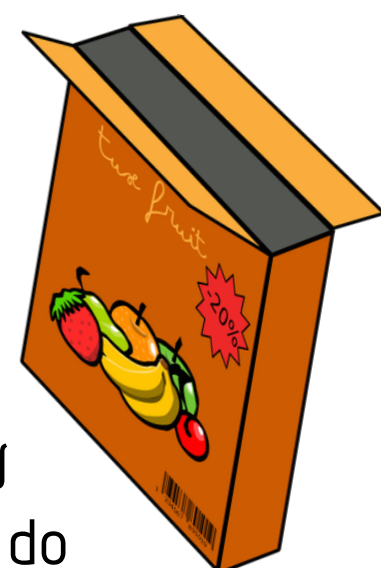

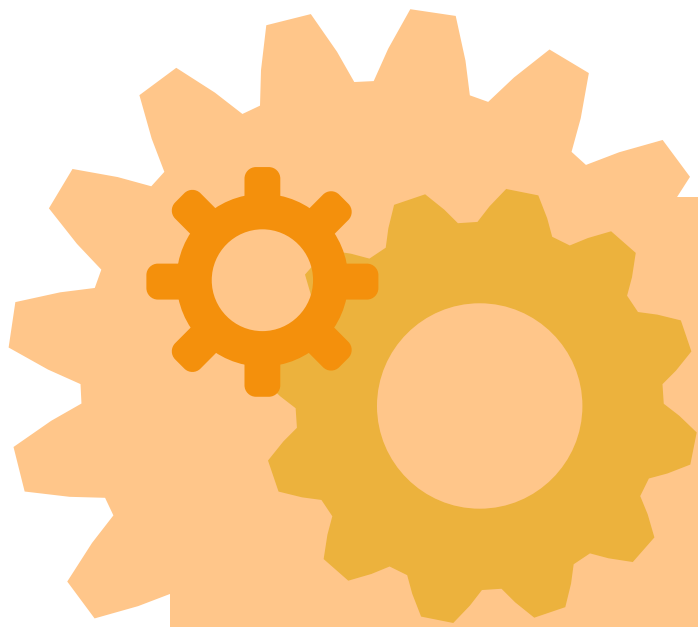
Create Club

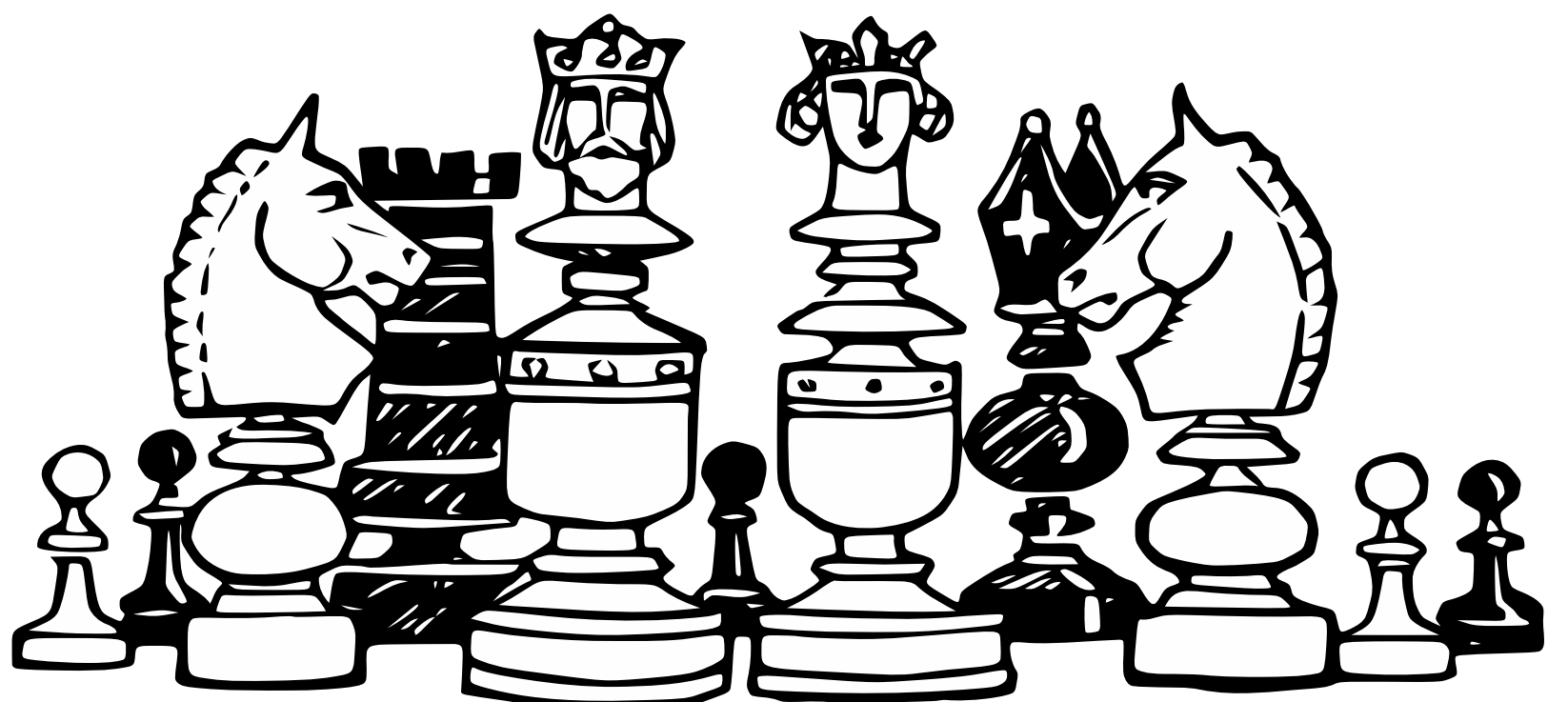

“Every chess master was once a beginner.” - Irving Chernev

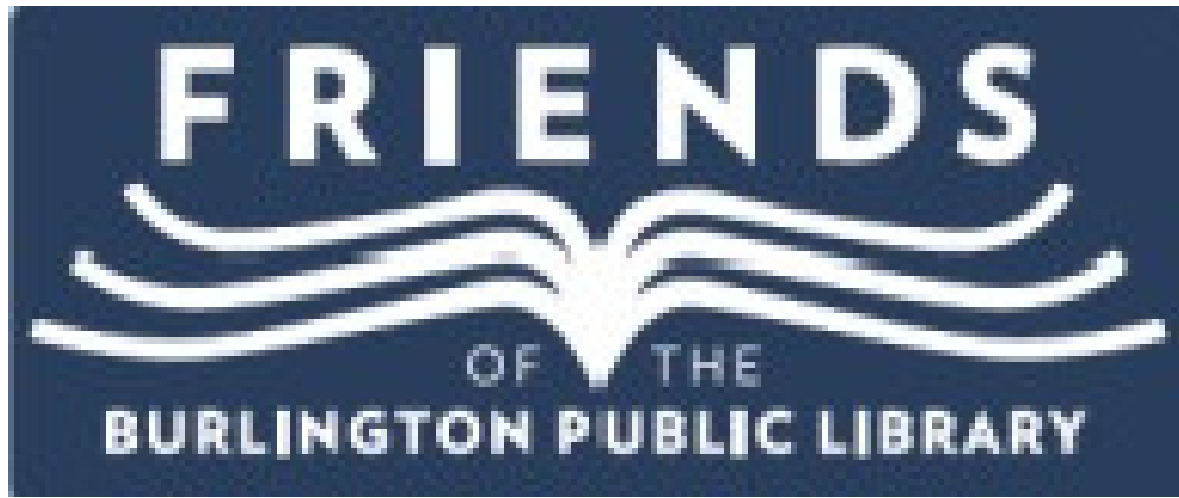
