Our Teen Advisory Board, locally known as TICOS (Teens Inspiring Change, Optimism, & Service) have been busy helping with the re-design of our teen space in the library. With a focus on staying true to the library's mission and values, our teens are imagining a space where kids will feel inspired and welcome to use our collection, hang out, and make new friends.

By shifting the adult non-fiction collection East, the teen area has opened up and now allows for groups to gather around tables and chairs. By sharing our success stories we're able to help add valuable insight to the larger conversation of what libraries are and how we're meeting the needs of our communities. Becky has been at the helm of this partnership for many years, as our BPL TICOS celebrated their 10th birthday in March.

National Library Week

April 7th - 13th was National Library Week, a time to recognize the various departments and teams of people who help libraries thrive. First celebrated in 1958, this dedicated week in April calls attention to the various triumphs and struggles of libraries today.

From circulating non-traditional items to providing connection to social services, modern libraries are meeting the needs of our communities in creative and impactful ways. Each year during this week the American Library Association releases their State of America's Libraries report, publishing the previous calendar year's statistics on book banning.

With a 65% increase of unique titles banned in 2023 over 2022's numbers, last year saw a total of 4,240 titles challenged. Historically, the Office for Intellectual Freedom saw an average of 273 titles challenged annually during the two decades prior to 2021.
